CFMHN meets with Honourable Carolyn Bennett, MP



On Friday, April 1, Sarah Flogen, President of CFMHN and Danijela Ninkovic, CFMHN member and constituent of St. Paul's riding, together with Sylvain Brousseau, President of the Canadian Nurses Association (CNA) and Lucas Veiga, Lead, Public Affairs at CNA, met with the Honourable Minister Carolyn Bennett, the first federal Minister of Mental Health & Addictions as well as members of her office (see screen shot attached)

The focus of the meeting was the current state of nurses stress (<u>see attached</u> <u>briefing note</u>).

Danijela and Sarah described how, in a prior culture of professional invincibility, nurses are beginning to name their stressors and needs so the time to act is now.

Main topics of the meeting were: the impact of nurse wellness on teams and health care delivery; the work of the national nurse wellness network; the need for evidence based, non-oppressive treatments when nurses have challenges with substance use. Minister Bennett spoke about a stepped care model for mental health and a national framework for mental health for health care workers. Sarah and Danijela offered support and opened the door to future conversation.


